

Partnership Knowledge Sharing – Overview Version: March 2020

Guiding principles

During and after Partnership-related research we want to share what we have learned with wider audiences, so that the knowledge we have gained can have a broader impact.

We acknowledge Partner self-determination on all Partner Research Project knowledge sharing.

A. Partner Research Projects

- Partners are encouraged to share their research findings within their **own community**, for example at community events, in writing (print or online), through video, podcast or other audio/visual means or through the preparation of relevant resources
- Partners are asked to share their research findings with the **wider Partnership**, by sharing the resources created in bullet point above, through a presentation at an All Partners' Gathering, and writing an update for our newsletter
- Partners are encouraged to share their research findings with the **public through media** interviews, web materials, or other media materials
- Partners are asked to consider sharing their research findings with an **academic audience**, for example through writing academic articles and/or presenting at scholarly conferences

B. Partner collaborations with an academic lead

- Where a Partner works with an academic lead on their research project, the Partner will take on responsibility to share findings with their community and the wider Partnership
- Co-authorship for sharing research findings with an academic audience will be negotiated on a case-by-case basis between the Partner(s) and academic lead(s)

C. Work done under the umbrella of NETOLNEW

i.) Partner Responsibilities & Rights

- Partners are asked to acknowledge their involvement in the overall Partnership (including SSHRC support) in their knowledge sharing
- Partners are asked to notify the Project Coordinator (netolnew@uvic.ca) about their knowledge sharing activities, to be included in our reporting back to SSHRC

ii.) Collaborators / Research Assistants Responsibilities & Rights

- Collaborators and RA's are required to consult with the Project Coordinator (netolnew@uvic.ca) prior to reporting out publicly on any grant-related work
